156/2005/JANUARY - REPORTS BACK FROM REPRESENTATIVES.

Dist Cllr March reported that a recent report about the Bonsall plan regarding planning has revealed that Bonsall is to lose its settlement statement and its settlement boundaries. Dist Cllr March will make further enquiries as to the consequences of these actions.

An application for Ball Eye Quarry to become a leisure/tourism area, has been looked on favourably by the District Council, rather than mineral extraction. It is expected that considerable improvement would be made regarding access.

The new Licensing plans start with applicants being able to apply for the new licences from 7th February 2005. The scheme becomes operational from 2nd November 2005.

Bonsall should receive their wheeled bins during the last week of January to the first week in February.

Cllr Headon reported that there had been another accident on the Via Gellia. This accident was caused by the road being icy and the road had not been gritted. The Clerk will write to DCC Highways dept.

Cllr Cruttenden reported that the Pro-Loco paintings had been brought to the village hall, as they were deteriorating in the Parish rooms. The village hall committee will be advised and asked to display the paintings in the village hall.

Cllr Cruttenden and Dist Cllr March attended the Standards committee at the District Council and reported that many of the complaints sent to the Standards Board for investigation were being sent back to local level to be settled.

Cllr Hind reported that he had taken a delivery of Village Design Statements, and it was decided to find storage space at the village hall for them.

Cllr Falconer reported that a meeting has been arranged with the owners of the properties for later this week.

Funding has been sought through Onyx Recycling.

A television programme is being looked into where a group of people come and restore a building over a period of several days.

Cllr Falconer has also contacted the Fairburn Trust for funding.

It was reported that during the recent high winds a chimney stack on the property has come down, and the building is being more unsafe.
